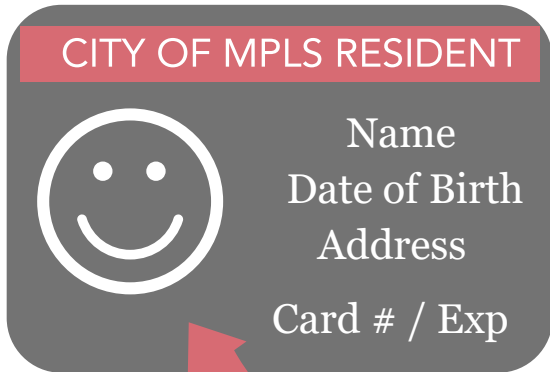


# On December 7th, Minneapolis City Council will be voting on a municipal ID ordinance.

## The Minneapolis Municipal ID would include:

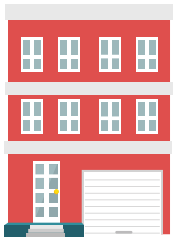

These would be available to ALL Minneapolis residents age 13 and older.

The card would be accepted within city boundaries and by selected city services, as a way to participate in civic and community activities.

## With this ID, you would be able to...



rent an apartment



open a bank account and deposit money



make medical appointments & pick up prescriptions



enter schools and other government buildings



interact with police

## The card could also be used as a...



transit pass

&



library card

Municipal ID's would benefit **EVERYONE**, but especially people experiencing homelessness, because this form of ID has significantly fewer barriers than obtaining a state ID or driver's license.

Municipal ID's would provide solutions to some of the challenges people experiencing homelessness face, such as:



*Applying to housing, safely & securely storing money, cooperating with police, entering schools and other government buildings, accessing healthcare, and limiting the number of documents needed on-hand*

People experiencing homelessness often experience theft of possessions while staying in unsheltered areas, and face barriers to crucial departments and processes. Municipal ID's are a great way to protect people experiencing homelessness, and prevent these losses.
